- We are currently looking into options for publishing a print on demand version with an electronic supplemental repository. The aim is to publish by the end of NEOH, or preferably for the final action conference.
- A complementary project funded by the Swiss Secretariat for Education and Innovation (SERI) is currently validating the evaluation framework. So far, experiences from other fields in which transdisciplinarity is applied have been collected in a workshop in Zurich and cases studies for the validation of the framework were identified within the International Society for Disease Surveillance (ISDS). The project staff is now conducting field work to assess the utility of the framework.

WG2: CASE STUDIES

- One-Healthness was evaluated (i.e. application of the handbook) in all case studies until June 2017 and feedback provided to WG1
- A Frontiers research topic dedicated to the NEOH Framework and the case studies supplemented with other work on framing One Health and Ecohealth is being edited (https://www.frontiersin.org/research-topics/5479). Eight case studies are submitted, three have been accepted, and 5 are under review.
- Applications for publishing fees were submitted to Helen O'Shea, Editorial Board Leader, for all the publications submitted for the Frontiers Special issue
- During November 2017 short narrative files were put together and shared with WG3 for the work on the meta-analysis

WG3: LITERATURE REVIEW

- A dedicated and active WG3 meeting was held in Skopje, Macedonia, in September (see below)
- The NEOH evaluation protocol was discussed and a condensed version was elaborated to gather data in a literature review
- This condensed version is being pilot tested by the WG3 leader, Vladimir Grosbois
- In January 2018, several WG3 members will spend a week or more in Montpellier,
 France, in a series of STMs to work jointly on this literature review and meta-analysis
- Volunteers are needed to help with the literature review

O WG4: ENGAGEMENT AND DISSEMINATION

- The NEOH brochure has been completed and hard copies have been sent out to a representative in each COST member country for dissemination. The e-Version can be downloaded from the NEOH website under "Resources".
- A new webmaster, Laura Craighead, has been identified, as Iona Edmonstone had to step down from her role. A big thank you to Iona for all her efficient and reliable work all that time!
