



Case studies

 Participants of NEOH action used access to available primary and secondary data from ongoing One Health projects in which they are involved in for evaluation.

• The NEOH handbook was applied to these case studies.



Inclusion criteria

- In total 12 case studies are evaluated.
- Criteria for choosing a case study for evaluation were:
 - an impact on humans, animals (and environment);
 - relevance at the European level;
 - interdisciplinarity and intersectoriality;
 - measurable benefits of One Health and
 - if it is a disease condition, it should be on the of priority list for Europe (EFSA, ECDC).



Evaluation aspects

- the ecological dimension,
- the social dimensions,
- the economic dimension, and
- the resilience and sustainability.
